Dear Speaker Johnson, Minority Leader Jeffries, Chairwoman Foxx, and Ranking Member Scott:

On behalf of the Act on RAISE campaign, which brings together stakeholders across the caregiving continuum to strengthen our nation's first-ever National Strategy to support America's 53 million family caregivers, we are writing in support of The Older Americans Act (OAA) Reauthorization Act of 2024 (S. 4776), which passed the Senate via Unanimous Consent on Tuesday, December 10, 2024. We implore Leaders and Members of the House to swiftly advance this critical policy to the President before the 118th Congress adjourns.

As we have outlined in previous statements of support and in our <u>Policy Brief</u> published earlier this year, The OAA serves as a vital resource for nearly 11 million older adults and an estimated 800,000 caregivers annually.^{1,2} For nearly 60 years, the OAA has supported a nationwide network of state, local, and community entities that enable older adults to age with dignity and independence in their homes and communities. OAA reauthorization is an important opportunity for Congressional leaders to strengthen supports for family caregivers in every community through the National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP).

The Act on RAISE Campaign members appreciate lawmakers' support for priorities reflected in the Senate-passed OAA reauthorization bill including, but not limited to:

- Reauthorizing the RAISE Family Caregivers Act and the Supporting Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Acts through 2029;
- Authorizing funding for OAA programs through 2029, which are essential to supporting family caregivers across the country; and
- Renewing and bolstering efforts to incentivize improved caregiver assessment activities and supports in the OAA.

While we support a number of other priorities that are included in the current legislation and are eager to work toward advancing some of the Campaign's priorities that were changed or eliminated in the compromise bill in future OAA reauthorization efforts—at this
